5 THINGS TO DO IN NORTH MAYO

1 The Bangor Trail
The Bangor Trail is a 39km walking trail starting in Newport and finishing in Bangor Erris.

Sometimes described as “the loneliest place in Ireland”, due to the isolated nature of the route, this challenging 39km trail takes you through all types of terrain — country roads, bog tracks, open countryside and across rivers. You won't see a house along the route, and you may not even meet another soul!

2 Belleek Woods Fairy Trail
Always wanted to look for fairies? Well now's your chance. Deep in beautiful Belleek Woods — one of the largest urban woods in Europe — a tiny new community has taken up residence among the trees.

As you follow the Belleek Woods Fairy Trail, you'll see their tiny little fairy houses, high in the trees and hidden in tree roots.

Colourful and miniature, each house reflects the character of its tiny resident.

The fairies love children and if you treat them well they may grant your wish.



3 Blanemore Forest Archaeological Park

Blanemore Forest, Moygownagh is the beautiful setting of the Blanemore Forest Archaeological Walk.

Only recently discovered, Blanemore is a treasure chest packed

with historical secrets.

Thanks to the efforts of the local community in Moygownagh, Blanemore Forest Archaeological Walk is open to the public.

Take a deep breath, inhale the history and see the sites of where your ancestors once walked.
